## ORPHEUS HELLENIC FOLKLORE SOCIETY: GREECE 2011

The Chicago-based Orpheus Hellenic Folklore Society recently made its fourth trip to Greece since its inception in 1989. This summer, almost one hundred and fifty Orpheus members and their families visited Athens and the island of Chios. Highlights included five successful dance and choral performances, meetings and workshops with local officials and dance groups, as well as excursions in Athens and around Chios.

The troupe's first performance was in Athens at the prestigious American College of Greece, Deree. The hour and a half long performance featured the Orpheus youth and adult groups performing a variety of dances from mainland Greece and the islands. Orpheus member, Nicole Mitroussias, accompanied by Nikos Papathanasiou on the piano, performed song selections from celebrated Greek composer, Manos Xatzidakis, and several Orpheus members addressed the audience, reflecting on what Greece means to them and what it feels like to have the rare opportunity to perform in the motherland. Many of the dancers, particularly the younger ones, commented that this trip was exceptionally meaningful to them. Not only were they first-time visitors to a country with such a remarkable history, magnificent scenery and centuries old traditions and culture, but more importantly it was an opportunity to proudly give a dynamic, traditional performance in the birthplace of their grandparents and parents.

Once in Chios, the performances continued. The troupe enjoyed performing in various picturesque locations on the island. The first performance in Chios was in the village of Parparia at the St. Paraskevi panegyri. Next was the dance festival in the beautifully preserved medieval village of Mesta, where Orpheus performed with several local Greek folk dance groups. Another performance was given at the town square in Chios Town, as Orpheus performed, once again, with several other local dance groups. At the Chios Town event, Dr. Mantikas, head of cultural affairs in Chios, welcomed Orpheus and commended the troupe on its continued efforts to preserve the Greek traditions and culture abroad. The last performance in Chios took place at the Golden Sand hotel in the town of Karfas, during the annual Chios omogenia dinner. At the dinner, Ms. Isabella Bournias, President of the Enosis Omogenon Chios Society, presented all the performers with parting gifts consisting of mementos from Chios. Ms. Bournias expressed similar sentiments as Dr. Mantikas and thanked Orpheus for choosing Chios as the latest Greece trip destination.

Orpheus members had the chance to learn several local dances, courtesy of dance instructors, Yannis Gribabis and Symos Karaoulanis. The instructors demonstrated Chios favorites such as "Ena Karavi Apo tin Chio", "Arap Sousta", "Agia Markella" and "Pyrgousikos". The dances learned in the workshops were immediately put to the test at the performance in Chios Town a couple of days later. Mr. Gribabis and Mr. Karaoulanis commented on Orpheus' strong and extensive dance skills and how organized and disciplined the group was, especially with so many younger members.

In addition to swimming in the warm waters of the stunning beaches of Mavra Volia and Komi, Orpheus members had the opportunity to visit various archeological, his-

torical and religious sites around the island. The itinerary included excursions to the shrine of Agia Markella, patron saint of Chios, where we were accompanied by Father Kaloudis from Holy Trinity church in Chicago, and a native of Chios; the remarkable monastery at Nea Moni; a tour of the masticha groves, and a lesson in masticha cultivation, Chios' main export; tours of ancient, historically rich villages, including Mesta, Pyrgi and Anavatos and a day trip exploring the impressive ruins in Ephesus, Turkey. While in Athens, Orpheus members also paid a visit to the magnificent national landmark, the Acropolis, and marveled at the extraordinary artifacts on display at the Acropolis Museum. ## To Reverse the Loss of Greece's Forests

In addition to tree planting, an aggressive program of fire-fighting has been instituted and in 1999, for the first time in millennia, reforestation exceeded destruction from fires.

The first forest was planted in Sounion in 1999 with the help of the Federation of ENOSIS and was named the "Forest of Illinois." Since then, several plantings have taken place in the area of Sounion. Trees have also been planted on the island of Samos, Samothrace, at Ancient Olympia, Vouliagmeni, Kalavryta, Arcadia, Delphi, Maniaki, Thraki, Crete, Messinia, Serres, Arta, Dion Pierias. Penteli and Patras.

## Matching Funds from the European Community

It is the single largest environmental program in the European Union for Greece and will be one of the most massive efforts in history involving the planting and cultivation of seedlings.

The government of Greece has also arranged with the European Union for the EU to match on a one-to-one basis the dollars generated through the Plant Your Roots program. Thus, for every tree we plant, the EU will match funds for four additional trees.



## "The citizens will judge us in 2013"

Greek prime minister George Papandreou said that his ruling PASOK party will bring Greece out of supervision and dependence and have it stand on its own two feet once again, addressing a PASOK national conference on Saturday, and effectively ruled out early general elections, saying that "the citizens will judge us in 2013" (when the current government's term in office ends).

By then, he added, "not only will we have succeeded in Greece emerging from the crisis but we will also have completed the many and important changes that will lay the foundations for a different course for Greece in the future".

Papandreou's address marked the opening of the two-day national conference, taking place amid stringent security at the Olympic Tae Kwon Do indoor complex in Neo Faliro, near Piraeus, which will set out the party's directions and priorities for the coming period. The conference is attended by PASOK members and friends, representatives of institutional social agencies and citizens' action groups.

According to an introductory note of the national conference, "at the present political, social and economic conjuncture, through mass and democratic procedures, PASOK is attempting to make deep changes that will re-determine the country's developmental priorities, strengthen the social cohesion and reinforce social solidarity and justice".

In a series of pre-conference meetings, discussions were held on six themes: Public Administration and Local Government, Development and change of production model, the Social State, National Security policy, Hellenism of the Diaspora, and PASOK and the socialist potential today.

The conference marks the 37th anniversary of the founding of the Panhellenic Socialist Movement on September 3, 1974, by the late former prime minister Andreas Papandreou, father of current prime minister and PASOK leader George Papandreou.

## "Early elections are inevitable"

Main opposition New Democracy (ND) leader Antonis Samaras said that early elections are inevitable for the government, in an interview with the Sunday edition of Eleftheros Typos newspaper, adding that "all control has been lost of the deficits and the debt".

Samaras said that the government's dead-ends were growing daily, since it b "policy has failed".

He reiterated that the government's programme is wrong, noting: "Of course there are many and large mistakes and delays in the implementation of the (economic) programme, but the programme itself creates a much deeper recession than originally predicted. That is why it is not meeting its targets.

## Restructuring of the Libyan economy is necessary

Greek foreign minister Stavros Lambrinidis pledged the ministry's firm support for Greek businesses active in Libya, during a meeting with representatives of the businesses on Wednesday.

Greeting representatives of businesses active in Libya, chiefly in the energy and construction sectors, Lambrinidis said that "the foreign ministry will seek to support your presence in Libya".

Lambrinidis noted that the restructuring of the Libyan economy is necessary both for the growth and democratisation of that country and for stability in the wider region, and made it clear that Greece must and will have a dynamic presence in the formulation of the so-called "day after".

He also noted that Greece is one of the first countries to have established diplomatic contact with Benghazi, with the presence over the past months of Greek diplomats who are in contact with the National Transitional Council.

Greece, the foreign minister stressed, is ready to reopen its embassy in Tripoli when the conditions allow.

## Model proposed for 500,000 new jobs by 2021

Study says Greece needs to be more productive and extrovert

A study made for the Federation of Hellenic

Enterprises recommends the adoption of a new National Growth Model that can create half a million new jobs in the next decade.

Conducted by McKinsey and Co counsellors and entitled "Greece 10 years ahead," the study suggests that the emphasis should be placed on four pillars: Competitiveness, productivity, the extrovert character and bolstering of investment.

It goes on to identify the five main sectors of the economy, tourism, retailing, energy, industry and agriculture, that can offer a fresh impetus on the economy and give it an average annual growth rate of 3 percent for the next 10 years.

The businesspeople, says the study that will be officially presented on Monday in Athens, will need to seek the creation of major enterprises through mergers and acquisitions, and the adoption of more efficient production methods.

The promotion of Greek brands in goods and services in foreign markets must be done in a systematic and timely fashion, the report argues, adding that Greece will need to dramatically increase the inflow of foreign capital, and take it above the European average. The privatization program can help in this direction, it concludes.

## First loss for Greece in the Eurobasket

## FYROM beats the national team by 14 points

Greece suffered a 14-point defeat in the hands of the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia on September 3, the national team's first loss in this European Championship.FYROM won 72-58 to rise to the top of the group's table, along with Greece, having beaten both of the pool's favorites, Greece and Croatia.

The Greeks seemed somewhat distracted from the propaganda war of their opponents (Skai radio reported that their government paid for fans to travel to Lithuania and sport flags and scarves with the name Macedonia and the star of Vergina on them) and were unexpectedly negative in attack.

FYROM had Bob McCalebb in a great day, scoring 27 points, as the Greek defence – Nick Calathes and Nikos Zisis in particular – could not contain him. What is more, the insistence on three-point shots despite a terrible scoring rate proved disastrous, as the Greek attack could not translate its dominance in rebounds into more points.

This first ever loss to FYROM may have no more consequences than the Greek prestige hurt, but is showing that the team of coach Ilias Zouros still has long way to go before it resembles the side that six years ago won the Eurobasket and reached the World Championship final by beating the US in 2006.


Captain Antonis Fotsis was Greece's top scorer with 16 points, while Yiannis Bourousis had 10 points and 10 rebounds.

About 6 months ago, the writer was watching a news program on oil andone of the Forbes Bros. was the guest. The host said to Forbes, "I am going toask you a direct question and I would like a direct answer; how much oil does the U.S. have in the ground?" Forbes did not miss a beat, he said, "more than all the Middle East put together." Please read below.

The U. S. Geological Service issued a report in April 2008 that only scientists and oil men knew was coming, but man was it big. 

# 4 Things you might not have known about your Cell Phone

**For all the folks with cell phones.** (This should be printed and kept in your car, purse, and wallet. Good information to have with you.)

There are a few things that can be done in times of grave emergencies.

Your mobile phone can actually be a life saver or an emergency tool for survival.

Check out the things that you can do with it:

#### FIRST (Emergency)

The Emergency Number worldwide for Mobile is **112**. If you find yourself out of the coverage area of your mobile network and there is an Emergency, dial 112 and the mobile will search any existing network to establish the emergency number for you, and interestingly, this number 112 can be dialed even if the keypad is locked. Try it out.

#### **SECOND** (Hidden Battery Power)

Imagine your cell battery is very low. To activate, press the keys \*3370#. Your cell phone will restart with this reserve and the instrument will show a 50% increase in battery. This reserve will get charged when you charge your cell phone next time.

#### THIRD (How to disable a STOLEN mobile phone? )

To check your Mobile phone's serial number, key in the following Digits on your phone: \*#06#.

A 15-digit code will appear on the screen. This number is unique to your handset. Write it down and keep it somewhere safe.

If your phone is stolen, you can phone your service provider and give them this code. They will then be able to block your handset so even if the thief changes the SIM card, your phone will be totally useless. You probably won't get your phone back, but at least you know that whoever stole it can't use/sell it either. If everybody does this, there would be no point in people stealing mobile phones.

#### And Finally....

#### **FOURTH** (Free Directory Service for Cells)

Cell phone companies are charging us \$1.00 to \$1.75 or more for 411 information calls when they don't have to. Most of us do not carry a telephone directory in our vehicle, which makes this situation even more of a problem. When you need to use the 411 information option, simply dial:

without incurring any charge at all. Program this into your cell phone now.

# Exports buck the gloomy trend Outward-oriented firms improve profitability

An outward-looking attitude is proving the most effective medicine for businesses hit by three consecutive years of Greek economic recession, an examination of the 2011 first-half results of 249 listed companies indicates.

hard-biting recession, is growing into a strong regional trading hub. Apart from confirming a trend toward a recordbreaking rise in exports (40.4 percent as a whole in the first-half, and 11.6 percent up excluding petroleum products), the



The relevant tables show that the most extroverted companies either boosted their profitability, maintained their profit margins at satisfactory levels, or even returned to profitability. Others entered new markets, expanding their client lists.

The tables show that the listed companies with the best profitability prospects are those oriented abroad (60-70 percent of turnover), or directly linked with the government's privatization program.

A considerable number of listed companies in this period appear to have reduced activities related to the Greek public sector and turned abroad. Others took more drastic steps, opting to do business exclusively abroad.

Hellenic Petroleum stayed for yet one more quarter the most profitable listed Greek enterprise, with after-tax profits of 179.16 million euros, benefiting both from a rise in the price of oil and or the dollar against the euro.

Separately, first-half data supplied by the Panhellenic Association of Exporters (PSE) indicate that Greece, despite its data also show important changes in the country's exports map.

"The Mediterranean basin is developing into a major market for Greek exports... The large rise in exports to neighboring Turkey, a strong increase in those going to the countries of North Africa and the Middle East... the recovery of exports to the USA, the penetration of new Asian markets and a boost in the exports of industrial products show that despite the fluctuations in the dollar-euro parity, Greek products are regaining the confidence of world markets," said Christina Sakellaridi, PSE president.

Italy was Greece's biggest customer in the first half, absorbing 1.04 million euros worth of exports, with Turkey in second place, with 866.6 million. Fuel exports rose by a whopping 343 percent, accounting for 27.6 of the total. Total imports fell 16.7 percent in the first quarter, further trimming the trade deficit.
